

From the Pastor:

October is Extraordinary Mission Month and World Mission Sunday today, on October 20th. I invite all in our diocese to take this opportunity to strengthen our ardor, passion and zeal for the faith with loving missionary hearts. We can respond to our missionary call by giving generously to the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in celebration of World Mission Sunday at the Masses of October 19-20. Your gifts support and sustain priests, consecrated religious and lay pastoral leaders in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, Latin America and Europe where, as Disciples, they proclaim the Gospel, build the Church and serve the poor.

Today is WORLD MISSION SUNDAY.

Each year the entire Church is invited to support the young mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the poorest of the poor. Your generosity today supports those most in need around the world.

The Confirmation Program, Sunday evening classes begin this evening at 6pm in the St. James Community Room. All 7th and 8th graders who do not attend CAA must be in attendance. The class concludes at 7:30pm. Please check the class schedule for future sessions. We try to follow the school calendar and avoid school holiday weekends.

I am happy to report that all 3 major renovation/construction projects at St. James and St. Mary's have now been completed:

1. The new roof at CAA was completed a few days after the new school year commenced. This roof replacement was done by

Sands Bros. Roofing, Antwerp and was necessary because of the significant leaks that we experienced last winter, especially in the old building. The total cost of this roof replacement was \$56, 000.

2. Lupini Construction, Utica completed Phase 4 of the St. James exterior tower restoration on Friday, October 11. This work entailed the exterior of the top of the east elevation and both the interior and exterior of the north elevation. While they were on site, they also repaired the 3 windows above the center church doors. Damage was done to the windows last winter during a wind storm. The old outer glass was removed and the window trim was painted and new glass installed. The total cost of all this work amounted to approx. \$93,000!

3. The painting of the exterior of St. Mary's Church has now been completed. The work was done by J. Smith and Sons, Port Leyden. The project involved scrapping and painting and also replacing many of the old shingles on the church. The back entrance of the church also had to be rebuilt with new wood and a door. I have not received the final invoice yet but it appears the total cost will be in the area of \$25,000.

October is RESPECT LIFE month. Life right of Watertown will be hosting a film festival in the JCC Sturtz Theater on Monday, Oct. 21. Two important films will be shown: HUSH and UN-PLANNED. Viewing times are as follows: HUSH at 5:30pm (short version) and UNPLANNED will follow. Then HUSH (longer version) will be shown.
