The Eucharistic Family

1. The family is a place of Eucharistic memory.

It is within the family that the liturgical feasts of the Church become part of daily life. In my family, we commonly remember the lives of the saints as part of our day-to-day experience. Sundays are savored as the family spends time together in holy leisure. We make pink cakes for Gaudete and Laetare Sundays, and we fast together on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by eating tomato soup and a bit of bread for dinner. The mystery of Christ's life is no longer an abstraction but lived in the flesh-and-blood ways that are normal to families.

2.. Families pray together.

It is important in our family that we have created a separate space for prayer, full of icons and candles for the sake of our common worship. Yes, we go to Sunday Mass. Sometimes, we go on weekdays too. But what happens in Mass does not stay there. We raise our voices to God each night as we sing hymns and psalms of praise. We mark liturgical time in these prayers, changing what we say and sing as the seasons of the Churh year move along. We bless one another.

3. We practice in daily family life all the dispositions necessary for Eucharistic worship of God.

We forgive one another transgressions both large land small. Each day around the dinner table we share what we are grateful for. We practice hospitality, welcoming friends, neighbors, and my students into our home. Not only do we cultivate these dispositions, but we talk about why they are important to us. Parents are the first catechists of their children, not because they are necessarily explaining every doctrine to their children. Rather, they are the first catechists because they explain why the mystery of Christ's life is so important to the culture of the family.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

That's why we remain hope-filled through the joys and sorrows of daily living. This Jubilee Year of Hope is so timely as we struggle through so many challenges in our world today.

Mary Magdalene shares this good news with Jesus' closest friends. Her profession of faith has become our commitment of life. Especially during this Jubilee Year of Hope, we seek a renewed determination to share the news that Mary Magdalene first witnessed. What we believe and our witness to that belief hinges on the great Easter Mystery we celebrate this day. Today we rededicate ourselves to living the Easter faith in union with our Risen Lord so we may one day come to share fully in His Risen life.

Today, our nation and our Church thirst for Resurrection evidence in you and in me. I pray that we may more fully live our baptismal promises: Lord, gift me with the courage, the love and the energy of Mary Magdalene, who was the first witness to others of your resurrection. Never let fear of ridicule or rejection, a lukewarm faith or laziness stop me from living openly and sharing warmly the Good News that Jesus Christ, who suffered and died for me, rose from the dead.

Rejoice in the hope and peace that our Risen Savior has won for us. A blessed Easter to you and your family! "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad!" After all, we are Christ-led, Christ-fed and Hope-filled!
