Advent is a time of waiting, longing and asking. It's a time to pray, "Come Lord Jesus".

From the Pastor:

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent - it is often called Gaudete Sunday or "Rejoice Sunday". It is our annual reminder that joy and laughter befit the Christian much more than sadness and gloom. St. Paul in the Scriptures tells us today: "Rejoice in the Lord always." The liturgical color shifts from purple to pink/rose. I am so happy that I get to wear my pink vestment today; it happens only once a year and I have been so excited that I haven't been able to sleep for days.

In the US today, there are more than 32,000 senior Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests. These religious worked tirelessly in Catholic schools, hospitals, and agencies, usually for little to no pay. As a result, many religious communities lack adequate savings for retirement and eldercare. Your gift to today's 2nd collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious helps provide medications, nursing care, and more. Please be generous.

Don't forget the Communal Penance Service at St. James, Monday evening at 7pm. The priests from Lewis County will be here to assist us in celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is a wonderful way to prepare for Christmas.

On the weekend of December 12-13, the parishes in our Diocese will conduct the annual appeal for the *Retirement Fund for Religious*, a collection that benefits some 30,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests.
