From the Pastor:

HAPPY 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT MERRY CHRISTMAS!

What a year it has been! I would have never imagined a year ago that we would face a worldwide pandemic that would change our lives so dramatically. But still, even as our daily lives have been upended, one thing has not changed: the love of God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. We will celebrate his birth in just a few days.

If possible, I hope you and your family will join us for one of the Christmas Masses at St. James. May the glory and the love of the infant Jesus fill your heart with joy. May every blessing of the Holy Season be yours.
