

Reminder for Mass Intentions Scheduling

We are blessed to have a large and faithful community here at St. James with over 860 families and with about 200 Masses available to be celebrated per year. We are unable to fulfill every Mass request. Canon Law states that Mass requests must be satisfied within a year's time.


In scheduling Masses, sometimes the same dates are special for more than one family, and we apologize if the date you wish is unavailable. To keep things equitable and to accommodate as many people as possible, you may reserve no more than TWO weekend Masses per year. Weekday Mass requests will be accommodated to the best of our ability.

When one deceased person gets FOUR or more Mass requests, the Mass will not be scheduled right away. The Mass request might get scheduled at a later date, as days are available.

Each month you are also given the opportunity to reserve a Monthly Memorial, that is, a sanctuary lamp candle, Mass candles, Our Lady Votive candle, St. Joseph Votive candle, and Altar Breads in memory of your loved one. Your intention will be printed in the bulletin at the beginning of each month.

Another option is to give a donation to the parish to honor your loved one on an important occasion or in memory of a deceased friend or family member. This allows special items to be purchased or projects accomplished in a loved one's name.

When there are an abundance of Mass requests, some Masses and their donations will be sent to the Propagation of the Faith or our retired priests, so that the Masses can be celebrated in a timely fashion.



Rite of Acolyte - We are pleased to announce that Garry Stevens will receive the Rite of Acolyte from Bishop LaValley on January 3 at Wadhams Hall in Ogdensburg. The role of an acolyte is to assist the priest and deacon during liturgical celebrations, particularly in the preparation of the altar and the distribution of Holy Communion. 

Retirement Plan for Priests - Christmas Collection

The Diocese of Ogdensburg's Retirement Plan for Priests has long been supported by a percentage of contributions from the annual parish Christmas collection. This year, 75% of the Christmas collection will be allocated to support the Plan, with the parish keeping the balance. Currently, 36 retired priests, and 12 active priests aged 70 and older, are expected to receive pension benefits of approximately one million dollars in the 2024-25 fiscal year. In addition, 100% of the cost of health insurance premiums for retired priests, estimated at \$250,000 this fiscal year, will be paid by the Plan. Your generous contribution not only supports current retirees but will also help provide for the retirement needs of priests who will retire in the future. Say thank you to your pastor and all priests of the diocese through a generous contribution to our Christmas Collection.
