

From the Pastor:

HAPPY FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY! HAPPY NEW YEAR!

We are hopeful also that our world will be more just, that life will be respected, that we might enjoy health and happiness. Although we may party at this time of year, we also have a lot of reasons to be here in church, to seek God's help in the coming year, and to thank Him for his help in the past. Mary, Mother of God and our spiritual mother gives us an example of how to enter into this new year in the sacred scriptures of this day. Every year Bishop LaValley sends out a special Christmas card far and wide. I am happy to say that this year the photo on the front of the card has some important people pictured – altar servers from across the Diocese and among them some from St. James – Ben and Anna Clark, Juliet Tavernier and Duane Olley, Jr. The photo was taken at the Cathedral in August when the servers attended the Diocesan Altar Server picnic with the Bishop. I have posted the card on the bulletin board found at the side door of the church, leading to the Community Room. Please take a look and see our important altar servers pictured with our Bishop.

It is hard to believe that our St. James Capital Campaign was held 3 years ago - INHERITED FROM THE PAST, PRESERVING FOR THE FUTURE. Parishioners responded very generously to the Campaign, allowing us to renovate the interior of the church and much of the exterior. Many people made 3-year pledges and now most of those pledges have been satisfied. So, our contributions to the Campaign have dwindled. With that in mind, both the Parish Finance Council and the Parish Council recommended that we insert a special monthly envelope in the packet to hopefully continue the momentum and provide some much needed revenues for the parish. We would really like to continue the exterior restoration on the church next spring/summer. In order to do that, it will be necessary to have a successful 2nd collection each month for Buildings and Grounds. You will find the envelope in your new packet and even though the actual date is not printed on the envelope, it will be taken up on the first Sunday of each month. So, beginning next weekend and every first Sunday, the 2nd collection will be taken for that purpose. This envelope and collection are somewhat reminiscent of the old Heritage Fund from years ago. Please be as generous as you can. Our future depends on this.

Two major improvements at St. James: 2 parking lot lamp posts were repaired recently – one in the lot by the handicap ramp and the other in the lot across from the parish office by the old garage. These lights are now fixed and offer bright, safe lighting for us. The lamp post by the old garage has not worked in many, many years and is a huge improvement for those who park in that area at night. I want to thank Duane Olley, Todd Rogers and Dan Leary for making this all possible.
