



From the Pastor:

For those parishioners who weren't around last weekend, I announced that the St. James Capital Campaign had not only reached its goal but had exceeded it!! As of Tuesday morning, January 10 the total in donations and pledges was \$887,000!! This is an incredible achievement and I want to thank all those who participated in any way. When we began the Campaign back in September, I was hoping and praying that we would be able to reach the \$850,000 mark, but to go over it has been very rewarding. It is a testament to your love of this beautiful Church of St. James. I have an upcoming meeting with Scott Lupini from Lupini Construction to begin discussions about the restoration of the tower which will continue in the Spring/Summer.

At last week's Education Council Meeting, Sister Annunciata, SSJ announced that she will be retiring at the end of this school year. After much reflection and prayer, Sister has discerned that this is the best decision for her and I agree with her conclusion. Sister has spent most of her religious life in Catholic education and many of those as a Catholic School principal. Being a school administrator these days is not an easy position and Sister has been very dedicated and steadfast. I am grateful to her for what she has given to CAA for these many years. This move is bittersweet for us - we are glad Sister can move away from all the day-to-day tensions of administration, but it is sad for us realizing that for the first time in the long, long history of CAA, there will be no Sister of St. Joseph working at our parish school. I will have more to say about all this in the days ahead. Please pray for Sister and for CAA as we will commence a search now for a new School Principal. The Diocesan Education Department will assist us in the process.

Thanks to all who sent me Christmas cards, gifts and delicious goodies! I appreciated your kindness. I received many sweets. You probably have noticed that I have packed on a few extra pounds this holiday season. I have already chosen a new diet plan for 2017 so I can shed this extra weight. 
