

Statement from Bishop LaValley Regarding Mass Attendance During the Coronavirus Outbreak

In light of the serious health risks to vulnerable populations, and mindful of the instructions of medical professionals, the Bishops of New York State have urged the faithful to use their prudential judgment on whether or not to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days during the coronavirus outbreak. This is in keeping with the teaching of the Church, which has always exempted those with serious medical issues which would prohibit them from attending Mass, as well as for all people in times of general emergencies. This is especially true during this coronavirus outbreak, particularly for adults over the age of 60, people with underlying medical conditions, and family members of such individuals, who should take special care in discerning the best course of action.

Masses throughout the Diocese of Ogdensburg will continue to be offered at this time, contingent on emergency restrictions regarding large gatherings. We are taking steps to make attendance at Mass safe for those who attend. Additionally, to those choosing not to attend Mass due to illness or having an underlying condition, Bishop LaValley hereby grants a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass beginning immediately and continuing until further notice. Persons with underlying health conditions are especially encouraged to remain at home at this time. Those who do attend Mass are reminded that they should follow the guidelines in place, such as receiving Holy Communion reverently in the hand, not receiving the Precious Blood, being sure to wash hands/use sanitizer before and after Mass, and avoiding physical contact with or close proximity to other persons.

Additionally, at this time, we are asking pastors to ensure good and regular cleaning of surfaces that are touched regularly (such as door handles), that ministers of the Eucharist exercise good hygiene (washing or sanitizing their hands prior to distributing Holy Communion), and that holy water fonts are emptied. During Mass, the sign of peace will not be announced or exchanged. If the parish has the habit of holding hands during the Lord's Prayer, this practice should be halted at this time. We ask all participants to refrain from shaking hands before, during or after Mass. A complete listing of precautions can be found our diocesan website via a link on the diocesan homepage.

Those who will not attend Mass can follow the Mass on radio, television, or online where possible. This includes The Catholic Channel on Sirius XM (10:15 a.m. EDT from Saint Patrick's Cathedral and 1:00 p.m. EDT from the Cathedral of Our Lady of Angels), and the Mass from St. Mary's Cathedral at 8:00am Sunday on WQTK 92.7 FM, and television broadcasts (8:00am and 12:00pm on EWTN, 9:00am from St. Andre Bessette Parish, Malone, on Spectrum and 11:00am and 8:00pm from St. Bernard's Church, Saranac Lake, on Spectrum).

All are urged to keep in prayer those who are suffering from the coronavirus, as well as for doctors, nurses, caregivers, and all those who are working to combat the disease.

Directives in Response to Coronavirus outbreak.

The Diocese of Ogdensburg is actively following the directive of the county public health departments to ensure that all diocesan parishes, schools, ministries, and charities are responding appropriately to the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19).

While there are currently no confirmed cases in our diocese, we are still taking every necessary precaution. If confirmed cases begin to arise, the diocese may put additional guidelines into effect. At this time, the following are to be observed:

Bishop LaValley mandates all parishes, chapels and high school and campus ministries to make the following adjustments to liturgical practices:

- Clean surfaces and other facilities as frequently as possible
- Avoid coming to church (e.g., Mass, confirmation, Lenten missions, etc.) with common symptoms of illness (e.g., fever, cough, body aches) or if vulnerable to the effects of the coronavirus (e.g., those with chronic illness, and those with immune system deficiencies)

(There is no obligation to attend Mass when ill – Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181. A dispensation has been granted by Bishop LaValley to those who are vulnerable or ill – Code of Canon Law 1983, c. 1245)

- Empty holy water fonts and keep them completely dry
- Refrain from the practice of holding hands during the recitation of the Our Father
- Omit the Sign of Peace or exchange it without physical contact
- Suspend distribution of the Precious Blood of Christ from the chalice
- Practice good hygiene, particularly when distributing Holy Communion
- Refrain from the practice of priests and deacons placing hands on the heads of children or adults when blessing those who are not receiving Communion
- Clean all liturgical vessels with soap and water after each Mass, including any pyx that is taken to a nursing home, hospital, the homebound, etc.
- Greet priests or deacons after Mass without physical contact

Bishop LaValley strongly recommends that all parishes and high school and campus ministries take the following liturgical precautionary measures:

- Ensure that maintenance staff or volunteers wipe down pew railings, hymn books, door handles, restroom surfaces, etc. after each Mass
- Use hand sanitizers and disinfectant wipes as part of good hygiene practices
- Provide collection counters with sterile gloves when counting the offertory collection
- Encourage parishioners to receive Holy Communion reverently on the hand
- Take all necessary precautions when visiting the sick or homebound
- Refrain from visiting those who are quarantined due to the coronavirus (COVID-19), unless by a priest for the purpose of celebrating the sacraments in danger of death

From the Pastor:

Next weekend, Father Wm.(Bill) Muench will be here to begin our Lenten Parish Mission. Father will celebrate the weekend Masses and then will celebrate a Lenten Mass on Monday and Wednesday, both at 7pm. Father will conduct a Lenten Penance Service on Tuesday, March 24. I am hoping many parishioners from St. James and St. Mary's will participate in this Lenten experience.

As you can well imagine, we are attempting to monitor and mitigate the various dangers of the coronavirus threat. Starting now, the Bishop and Dept. of Worship have requested that Holy Communion be distributed only under one species (in the form of bread). There will be no communion chalices. You are strongly being asked to take the host in your hands rather than on the tongue. As much as you try, you can still get saliva on your finger when you are distributing. It's hard to be sanitary.

I am grateful that a number of parishioners have indicated that they would like to serve on the St. James 200th Anniversary Planning Committee. Next year – 2021 – is a BIG year for St. James as we celebrate this important milestone. It will take many months of planning in order to get ready for this event. Unfortunately, I can't seem to find a free evening before Easter to have a meeting. Therefore, the first meeting for the Planning Committee will be Tuesday, April 21 at 7pm in the Community Room. Please mark your calendar. I am happy to report that Joseph Margrey has agreed to chair the 200th Anniversary celebration. Each of the 12 months of 2021 will have their own celebration event and will be chaired by different groups or individuals.

Don't forget that the monthly St. James coffee and donuts will be TODAY after the 10am Mass. Please join us downstairs.

Also, the Lent Adult Enrichment program – *From Genesis to Jesus* – continues each Monday eve. at 6:30pm in the Community Room. This Lenten program is designed to enlighten adults about their faith – what a wonderful opportunity offered to the adults of St. James and St. Mary's.

The St. James Fair is right around the corner! An important Fair Planning meeting will be this Tuesday at 7pm in the CR.

There has been some serious discussion about having a Summer Vacation Bible School at St. James. Most large parishes have these kind of summer programs. There is an important planning meeting this Thursday at 7pm in the CR. If you can help with this project, please come! Many volunteers are needed or this will never get off the ground.

The Spring Jingle Fun Run/Walk is next Saturday. This fundraiser for CAA was postponed from December to now. Please consider coming out and walking or running with us. It is always a very good time. You can register at the school or at the event which begins at 9am.

Did you ever consider this: God didn't create anything without a purpose, but mosquitoes come close!


