

What's My Vocation? Distilling wisdom from YouTube

Fr. Mike Schmitz is the Chaplain for Newman Catholic Campus Ministries at the University of Minnesota Duluth. He also hosts a series of videos on YouTube by Ascension Press. The following is inspired by his video called "What's My Vocation?"

When you say the word "vocation," there are three separate ideas you might be talking about:

1. The universal call to holiness. Everyone on earth is called to be a saint, created to choose life with God in heaven forever.

2. An individual's state in life. God calls everyone to a particular state in life; marriage, religious life, or the priesthood. That state determines the relationship through which we become a saint. For example; a married person grows in self sacrifice primarily for spouse and family, a religious sister's primary relationship is becoming a bride of Christ, and a priest's is becoming a spouse to Christ's bride, the Church.

3. An individual's immediate tasks. Within your state in life, there are constant changes. For example, a married man's primary sacrificial relationship is to his wife, but that responsibility grows when a child is born. A priest might have his role change from parish pastor to campus chaplain.

Regardless of your vocation, you're called to die to self daily, to sacrifice yourself for the service of others. Those you serve are dependent on your state in life. It is through this service to husband, wife, Christ, and his Church—that we grow in holiness, and become more perfectly the person God created us to be.

From the Pastor:

Tomorrow morning all the priests of the Diocese will head for Lake Placid for their annual convocation with the Bishop. This event is also called the Presbyteral Assembly. This year it takes the form of a retreat and will last 4 days instead of the usual 3. Therefore, please check the Mass schedule to see the changes in the schedule with Communion Services on some of the days.

Next Monday is Memorial Day and the St. James Cemetery Mass is scheduled for 9am that morning. I have included the Rules and Regulations for St. James Cemetery, St. Mary's Cemetery and St. Peter and Paul Cemetery in today's bulletin. As you might remember, these Rules and Regulations were revised two years ago and I want everyone to be familiar with them again. Please join us next Monday for the annual Cemetery Mass.

Father Douglas Lucia, the Director of Vocations and Seminarians, has notified me that a Seminarian will be coming to St. James and St. Mary's for the months of June and July. Leagon Carlin from St. Peter's Church, Plattsburgh will be arriving around June 1. Leagon is completing his First Year of Theology studies at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD. You probably remember that 2 years ago Matthew Conger spent some summer months with us. We are delighted that Leagon has been assigned to us and we look forward to meeting him and we are grateful for his ministry to us.

THINGS TO DO: Sing-loud, skip the dishes, do cartwheels, eat ice cream cones and lick up the drips, wear your favorite jeans, go barefoot, make somebody laugh, dance in front of the sunset, live like the wild and beautiful child of God you are!

<u>St. James Cemeteries</u> - Many people have been seen in the Cemetery these last few days preparing their family burial plots for the Memorial Day celebrations. You probably remember that three years ago, the Cemetery Committee revised the Rules and Regulations which apply to all three cemeteries: St. James, St. Mary's and St. Peter and Paul. I am reprinting them again now to refresh your memory. Please adhere to these rules:

1. Potted plants, flowers in flower boxes or suitable metal containers may be placed on plots for special occasions (such as Memorial Day), but can only remain there for a period not exceeding two weeks. The Cemetery personnel reserve the right to remove all flowers, wreaths or other decorations from lots as soon as they become unsightly.

2. Due to hazardous conditions to the caretakers when using power equipment, artificial flowers, glass or plastic flower blocks, trees, ornaments of any kind, colored stones or pebbles, candles, vigil lights, crockery jars, decorative fences, any edging, shepherd's hooks or any type of container that the Cemetery personnel deems unsuitable, will NOT be allowed on any plot at any time. One small solar light will be allowed per grave site, placed near the stone for ease of mowing.

3. Small flags are permitted on graves, but they must be maintained and must be removed when they become worn.

4. Bicycles, skateboards, snowmobiles, motorcycles, horses, etc. may not be used on Cemetery property except with the approval of the Cemetery. Dogs are not permitted except when kept on a leash or in a vehicle.

5. When planting flowers, etc. on a plot, all debris (old planting containers) must be removed and discarded properly.
