

From the Pastor:

Tomorrow is MEMORIAL DAY and there will be a St. James Cemetery Mass at 9am. This is an important celebration as we gather to remember all of our deceased loved ones. If you have relatives or friends buried at St. James or the other 2 cemeteries, then you should try to attend this important Mass. Please bring a folding chair. Keep your eyes to the sky tomorrow morning. If there is a light sprinkle, please bring an umbrella. If it snows, bring a shovel and warm coat to the cemetery. If there is a downpour, then meet me at the church at 9am for the Mass.

It is hard to believe that the St. James Fair is only a little more than a month away. We have had several planning meetings to prepare for this important parish event — June 22, 23 and 24. More workers are needed to cover all the bases. There is a sign-up sheet in the Gathering Area of the church, so you can sign up to work. If you can give us just a few hours, it would be greatly appreciated by all. Some raffle tickets have been mailed to parishioners. If you didn't receive any, you can pick up some in the Gathering Area. The raffle is a great money-maker for the Fair. Please try to sell some tickets for us. And the BIG news around the parish is that the Pastor will be going in the dunking booth again this year and he is very excited about getting dunked. He has brand new outfits to wear!

Next Sunday is Pentecost Sunday – the feast of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of our Church. Please wear something red to Mass next weekend. If you don't have anything red to wear, we will provide something for you when you arrive for Mass.

Many people have been seen in the Cemetery these last few days preparing their family burial plots for the Memorial Day celebrations. You probably remember that last fall, the Cemetery Committee revised the Rules and Regulations which apply to all three cemeteries: St. James, St. Mary's and St. Peter and Paul. I am reprinting them again now to refresh your memory. Please adhere to these rules:

- 1. Potted plants, flowers in flower boxes or suitable metal containers may be placed on plots for special occasions (such as Memorial Day), <u>but</u> can only remain there for a period <u>not exceeding</u> two weeks. The Cemetery personnel reserve the right to remove all flowers, wreaths or other decorations from lots as soon as they become unsightly.
- 2. Due to hazardous conditions to the caretakers when using power equipment, artificial flowers, glass or plastic flower blocks, trees, ornaments of any kind, colored stones or pebbles, candles, vigil lights, crockery jars, decorative fences, any edging, shepherd's hooks or any type of container that the Cemetery personnel deems unsuitable, will NOT be allowed on any plot at any time. One small solar light will be allowed per grave site, placed near the stone for ease of mowing.
- 3. Small flags are permitted on graves, but they must be maintained and must be removed when they become worn.
- 4. Bicycles, skateboards, snowmobiles, motorcycles, horses, etc. may not be used on Cemetery property except with the approval of the Cemetery. Dogs are not permitted except when kept on a leash or in a vehicle.
- 5. When planting flowers, etc. on a plot, all debris (old planting containers) must be removed and discarded properly.

The St. James Fair Set Up Committee is looking for volunteers to help set up and tear down the fair. If you are willing and able to help for an hour or every day, please contact Joe Margrey at 493-1430. Pray for good weather.

Set up begins Saturday morning, 17 June at 9:00AM. At that time we will set the tent frames. This should only take 2-3 hours.

Monday 19 June through Wednesday 21 June we will set up the tents, place the equipment, etc. Each night's work begins at 5:00PM until dusk.

Tear down will be Sunday, 25 June beginning at 9:00 AM. If the weather cooperates we can get everything down and put away so work on the church can begin again on Monday. I also provide lunch on Sunday.
