

# Dear Daughters and Sons of St. James & St. Mary's,

Greetings of peace, love and good will from me to all of you. I cannot quite express my great joy at receiving many letters with words of encouragement and gifts from you. It's been a long time since I have written a letter of greetings. Since I have been living at the Pontifical College Josephinum, a lot has changed during my first two months, and I thought that I should write a letter letting you know what is going on in my human, intellectual, spiritual, and pastoral formation. I wish I could call you all to share my experiences with you, but I have a busy schedule here that starts from 6:45 am to 8:30 pm, so I think this may be a better way to talk to you.

Here, at the Pontifical College Josephinum, they are very conservative, and their schedule is pretty tight, but the formation is worthy of praise as they are doing a wonderful job. I am glad to find such a wonderful seminary in which I have my Latin all the time. Here we have Latin Mass every first Friday of the month and Spanish Mass every Thursday of the week; unfortunately, there is no French Mass. Now, I have to practice at least three languages: English, Spanish, and Latin.

Here at the Pontifical College Josephinum, I feel that all the other 54 seminarians welcome me as their brother and accountability partner, and I feel the same about them. When I first got here, I was complaining a lot about food because they did not know that I had a special diet. For the first two weeks, I used to go to the refectory for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, but I found nothing good for a vegetarian like me. As a result, I lost three pounds in two weeks. A special word of thanks to Mrs. Joanne Norrgard, who sent me some corn during that time; I really appreciated that. If you are good fans of chicken, you probably fit in here because they mostly serve chicken every other day. After three weeks, the Holy Spirit finally put the salad bar back, and I now have gained four more pounds. I can't complain at all. I don't know what kind of help I need, but it's like I see God's love and grace in my life all the time.

In terms of my human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral formation, I set up some personal goals for the academic year. For instance, this year, in terms of my human formation, I have some essential points that I need to work on. First of all, I am working hard to let God's Word open the door to my heart and guide my life so that I might be more forgiving, patient and compassionate to everyone. Second, during my time here at the Pontifical College Josephinum, I continue to place the highest value on the work of priestly formation in order to be ready for the mission of the Church, especially the evangelization of the children of God, service and communion. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations," says Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew 28:19. Third, I am working intensely to remain in perfect communion with Christ and His mission. Fourth, I am striving to take advantage of all the advice I receive from my formation advisor, spiritual director, professors, priests, deacons, students, and other staff members who engage in my priestly formation to help me deepen my understanding of my future ministry and of some other great responsibilities as a future priest. In addition, I do my utmost to be in the chapel at least 10 minutes before the clock strikes. Last, I'm still working on my time management. Sometimes I have so many things to do, and I don't know where to start. It's a crucial academic year for me, so I need to set up my daily schedule once for all. This means that in addition to the mandatory activities at the Pontifical College Josephinum, I have definitely set up a time for my personal prayers, meditation, personal tasks, and hobbies. (I play soccer at least twice a week.)

In my spiritual life, there is one important point on which I have to work. I must cultivate a perfect desire to know God more profoundly, to develop a deeper prayer life with God, and to grow completely in His love. Often I feel alone, and I look around me, but I don't see anyone coming to my assistance. I ask myself, why am I feeling lonely? The response is always clear and straightforward: God needs me to be patient and to stay concentrated on prayer. Much of my dissatisfaction with my attempts at prayer arises from the fact that I am really trying to please myself instead of trying to please God. This is the reason why I am so distracted while praying, and sometimes God the Father is not happy with me. Hence, I react promptly with a vigorous decision never to give up my daily prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, no matter how futile the whole thing may seem—I make a daily appointment with God. My whole spiritual life hinges upon spiritual readings and the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. This year, I pledge to continue regularly doing my spiritual readings and personal prayer before bedtime, to attend every Holy Hour, and to pray the Rosary at the same time. In fact, I nourish my mind with thoughts about God by reading—I develop and digest such thoughts by daily *lectio divina*—and then I speak to God in my own words and in my own way by prayer. In addition, every month, I promise to spend at least one day not using any social media so that I can concentrate on my meditation and my relationship with God. Next, going to have a week of silent retreat off campus. That first day is going to be a great one for me because it's going to be the exact day of my birthday, and I'm planning to have a birthday party with four other seminarians from the Diocese of Ogdensburg: Lukas, Tyler, Venes and Dennis.

For my intellectual formation, I promise to improve my public speaking, listening, and writing skills. How is it possible? First, I continue reading books, journals, and doing my daily research. Second, I spend more time listening to audio on USCCB every day to improve my listening and pronunciation. Last, but not least, I try to learn how to talk more slowly and clearly.

Regarding my pastoral formation, if Covid-19 gives me the green light, I will make myself available to go wherever the Pontifical College Josephinum sends me for my pastoral works. For instance, I'm ready to teach Catechism to kids, teenagers, and adults and also to work with different ethnicities. In addition, I'm ready to minister to the sick in nursing homes, hospitals, and hospices, just to name a few.

Last of all, I really appreciate your tremendous generosity towards me. Before I went to the seminary, and until now, some of you have generously shared what you have with me. I think you might be interested in having some ideas about how your money has been used. If so, I'm going to give you a little report. I've received an amount of \$1,200 from your gifts. Here are some details: I bought a cassock for \$297.41; two clerical shirts for \$90.00; and two Bibstocks, a tonsure collar, ready-made and one cincture with fall & fringe for \$165.42 US + \$63.00 US shipping. I also paid a 6-month premium of \$516 for my car insurance with a \$76.00 discount. I'm not good at math, but I think I already spent a total of \$1,055.83.

Due to the pandemic and my seminary's restrictions to protect our holy seminarians, I will not be able to travel to Carthage, NY, for Thanksgiving. However, you are in my thoughts and in my prayers. Please keep up the good work for the greater honor and glory of God. I have never ceased to pray for the repose of the souls of my good friends, Lucille and Leo. I miss them all. May their lives be filled with love, hope, and happiness in heaven as I continue to pray for them.

Dear Daughters and Sons of St. James and St. Mary's, with these few lines I wanted to let you know how often I think of you, especially in these difficult times of the pandemic, and how close I am to you in prayer. Please pray for me that I may continue to be a good man of God for as long as the Lord may wish. I entrust your unceasing compassion and love to the maternal protection of Mary, Most Holy, whose home was a school of compassion, goodness, love, positivity, happiness and of grace. May Almighty God bless you all!
