Did You Know...About Kneeling

Humility at Prayer: Our kneeling at prayer, be it at church, at our bedside, or by a young child, can communicate many different affects and values. Piety, penance, adoration, and supplication are but a few, and kneeling might mean any one or several of these, depending on context.

Notably, at Eucharist, the postures of those gathered at prayer have varied broadly over time and space, sometimes with the assembly and the presider sharing a common posture, and in more recent times a dissimilar posture. At least partly because of this, in some ways, kneeling has come also to represent theologies of humility and differentiation.

When kneeling in humility, we can recognize, rightly that God is God and that we are not.
